б	§708. Assessors to value real estate and personal property

	The assessors and the chief assessor of a primary assessing
10	area shall ascertain as nearly as may be the nature, amount and value as of the first day of each April of the real estate and
12	personal property subject to be taxed, and shall estimate and record separately the land value, exclusive of buildings, of each
14	parcel of real estate. <u>The assessors and the chief assessor of a</u> primary assessing area shall revalue all real estate and personal
16	property at least every 10 years.

22	This bill requires revaluation of assessed property at least every 10 years.
