Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2.

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

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18 FISCAL NOTE

Expanding the eligibility for tuition waivers at state postsecondary educational institutions will have a minimal impact on tuition revenue at the Maine Maritime Academy, the Maine Technical College System and the University of Maine System.

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The Finance Authority of Maine will incur insignificant additional costs to review eligibility for these waivers. These costs can be absorbed within the authority's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment accomplishes the following purposes:

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- It adds a definition of "emergency medical service" to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, chapter 429;
- 2. It clarifies the definition of an "emergency medical services person" as a licensed provider who is serving a public agency in an official capacity as an officially recognized or designated employee, as a member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew who serves with or without compensation or as an employee of a nonprofit emergency medical service; and

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3. It establishes a definition for "public agency" as a governmental entity or a political subdivision as defined under Title 14, section 8102.

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The amendment also changes the title of the bill and adds a fiscal note.
