34	Current law provides a tuition waiver at a state postsecondary educational institution for a child or spouse of a firefighter or law enforcement officer who has been killed in the
36	line of duty. This bill extends the tuition waiver to a child or spouse of an emergency medical services person who has been
38	killed in the line of duty. An emergency medical services person is a person licensed to perform emergency medical treatment
40	pursuant to the Maine Emergency Medical Services Act of 1982.
