COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1204, L.D. 1714, Bill, "An Act to Clarify and Improve the State's Solid Waste Management Laws"

Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "TABLE II" in that part relating to "1304, Waste management" by striking out all of paragraph B (page 2, lines 31 to 40 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'B. Sludge Residuals compost facility		
1. Type I	150	150
2. Type-IA	150	150
3. Type II and Type III less than 3,500 cubic yards	175 700	500
4. Type-III	175	750
5. Municipal-solid waste Type II and Type III 3,500 cubic yards or greater'	175 1,400	850

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

Revising solid waste fee schedules may result in increased costs to municipalities if the net changes in the fee schedules represent an increase in fees paid. The fee changes do not

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2 require municipalities to expand or modify their activities,
therefore, it does not represent a state mandate pursuant to the
Constitution of Maine.

6 The revision of certain dedicated fees will not result in
any net change in total revenues collected by the Department of
Environmental Protection.

10 The State Planning Office will incur some minor additional
costs to provide additional planning assistance to municipalities
and regions for solid waste management. These costs can be
12 absorbed within the office's existing budgeted resources.'
