Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17851, sub-§4, ¶B, as amended by PL 1997, c. 740, §3 and amended by c. 769, §2, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

B. Became a state police officer after August 31, 1984 and completed 25 years of creditable service as a state police officer.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17851-A, sub-§1, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 769, §11, is repealed.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §17851-A, sub-§4, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 769, §11, is repealed.

SUMMARY

This bill allows a state police trooper to qualify for benefits under the Maine State Retirement System if the trooper was hired after August 31, 1984 and has 25 years of creditable service. This bill also removes state troopers from the provisions of the 1998 Special Plan.
