COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1229, L.D. 1758, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Victims' Compensation Fund Law"

Amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 6 in the 3rd and 4th lines (page 1, lines 26 and 27 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "sustained bodily injury or the threat of" and inserting in its place the following: 'been threatened with'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 5 the following:

'Sec. 6. 5 MRSA §3360-D, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 806, §3, is amended to read:

2. Release of records. If--required--by--the--board--the claimant--shall--execute--a--release--of--medical--and--employment records--and--information--enabling--the--board--to--obtain--the--records and--information--directly. A signed application for benefits under this chapter is effective under state law to authorize the release of health care, mental health, employment and wage information pertinent to the claim. Additionally, the claimant shall provide the board with other information or the release of such other information as the board determines is reasonably necessary to decide the claim.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 8 the following:

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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SUMMARY

The amendment strikes language regarding bodily injury from the provision dealing with eligibility, as this language is superfluous. The amendment provides that a signed application is effective under state law to authorize the release of health care and employment information. The signed application would comply with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 1711-C, subsection 3. The amendment authorizes the Department of the Attorney General to hire one Research Assistant to help administer the Victims' Compensation Fund. The amendment also adds a fiscal note and an allocation provision to the bill.
