	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §272, sub-§3 is enacted to read:
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6	1. Development of statewide smoking cessation program. The department shall develop, implement and maintain a smoking
8	cessation program that offers treatment services and resources on a statewide basis, trains and certifies tobacco cessation
10	specialists and integrates smoking cessation into the health care and substance abuse treatment systems. The program must:
12	A. Address the needs of all smokers, especially teenage
14	smokers;
16	B. Use nationally recognized standards for treatment services and the gualifications of tobacco cessation
18	specialists. Treatment services must include behavioral counseling and cessation-specific pharmacotherapy available
20	at least through workplaces, schools, health coverage plans, health providers' offices, hospitals and community health
22	<u>centers;</u>
24	C. Provide professional education programs for health professionals, specialist training and certification,
26	treatment and resource development, systems integration, policy development, program monitoring and evaluation and

30 32	<u>D, Include the promotion of workplace policies that encourage smoking cessation and minimize barriers to cessation.</u>
34	Sec. 2. Report. By January 1, 2000, the Department of Human
36	Services shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on its progress in establishing a statewide smoking
38	cessation program pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 272, subsection 3, including in the report any
40	additional legislation required to establish the program. The committee may report all legislation based on the report to the
42	Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature.
44	Sec. 3. Funding smoking cessation programs. The Department of Human Services shall fund the smoking cessation program developed
46	as described in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 272, subsection 3 with 1/4 of all new funding over \$3.5 million
48	received by the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program.
50	SUMMARY
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This bill directs the Department of Human Services to develop a statewide smoking cessation program and provides minimum requirements for the program. It requires a report by January 1, 2000, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on progress in establishing a statewide smoking cessation program, including in the report any legislation required to establish the program. It requires smoking cessation programs to receive funding under the tobacco prevention and control program.
