26	SUMMARY
28	This bill enhances enforcement of fish and game laws, marine resources laws and motor vehicle laws by making enforcement
30	easier and reducing the number of contested cases. Several crimes are redefined as civil violations to allow efficient
32	processing by the courts. Violators have the right to contest the matter in court.
34	
36	This bill revises the responsibilities of game wardens by allowing them to take cash or credit card payments for bail in any location when an arrest is made. Game wardens making arrests
38	in Cumberland County may take the defendant to any District Court serving Cumberland County, rather than being limited to the
40	closest court.
