An Act to Change the Charter of the Eastport Port Authority.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, the Port of Eastport provides valuable economic benefits to all the people of Washington County; and б 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 10 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 12 safety; now, therefore, 14 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: Sec. 1. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §1, 2nd ¶ is repealed. 16 Sec. 2. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §1, 3rd ¶, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 18 82, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place: 20 A board of directors is established to exercise the power 22 and duties of the authority. The board consists of the following 13 voting members: 24 1. The city manager of Eastport, who serves ex officio; 26 2. The president of the Eastport City Council, who serves 28 ex officio; 30 3. A representative appointed by the Department of Transportation; 32 4. Four members who are residents of the City of Eastport. 34 The members must be elected by a majority of the legal voters at an election, for terms of 4 years, in the same manner and at the 36 same time as Eastport city councilors. The term for a member elected under this paragraph begins January 1st and that member 38 serves until a successor is duly elected and gualified; and 40 5. Six members, consisting of 2 members from each of the 3 Washington County commissioner districts established under the 42 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 66, subsection 15. The county commissioners of each district must initially appoint 44 2 members by majority vote within 30 days of the effective date of this paragraph. These members serve until December 31, 2000. 46 The members must be elected at the next general election, to be held November 2000. At that election, members from the 3 county commissioner districts must be elected by a majority of the legal 48 voters of those districts voting at that election. The election

must be held in the same manner as an election for Washington 2 County commissioners. The elected members serve for 3-year terms. The term for an elected member begins January 1st and that member serves until a successor is duly elected and 4 gualified. A member under this paragraph may not be elected to more than 2 consecutive terms. б Sec. 3. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §1, 4th ¶, as amended by P&SL 1993, c. 8 82, $\S1$, is further amended to read: 10 Vacancies of elected directors that may occur by death, resignation or otherwise are filled by appointment of the eity 12 council appointing authority for that director, until a successor 14 is elected at the next election of directors. Sec. 4. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §3, first paragraph, 3rd sentence from the 16 end is amended to read: 18 The bonds and notes shall--be are legal obligations of the authority, which is hereby declared to be a quasi-municipal 20 corporation within the meaning of the Maine Revised Statutes, 22 Title 30 30-A, section 5053 5701, and all the provisions of the section shall be applicable thereto. 24 Sec. 5. P&SL 1977, c. 14, §3, first paragraph is amended by adding 26 after the 3rd sentence from the end a new sentence to read: 28 For the purposes of the debt liability of the Eastport Port Authority, on and after January 1, 2000 the guasi-municipal 30 corporation includes all the personal property of the residents and the real estate within the boundaries of Washington County. 32 Sec. 6. Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when 34 approved only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters within Washington County as an election called for 36 that purpose and held by December 31, 1999. The election must be 38 called by the municipal officers of the respective towns within Washington County and must be held at the regular voting places. The election must be called, advertised and conducted according 40 to the law relating to municipal elections. The registrars shall make a complete list of all the eligible voters of the proposed 42 authority as described in this Act. The list prepared by the registrars governs the eligibility of a voter. For the purposes 44 of registration of voters, the registrars of voters must be in 46 session the secular day preceding the election. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the following question: 48

"Do you favor amending the Eastport Port Authority charter 2 to include 6 representatives from Washington County and to expand the liability for new bonds issued by the authority from all 4 property within the boundaries of the City of Eastport to all property within the boundaries of Washington County?" б The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed 8 against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. 10 The results must be declared by the municipal officers and due certificates of the results filed by the clerks with the 12 Secretary of State. 14 This Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon its approval by: 16 A. A majority of the legal voters of the City of Eastport 18 voting at the election; and 20 B. A majority of the legal voters in Washington County, not including votes cast in the City of Eastport, voting at the 22 election. 24 **SUMMARY** 26 This bill expands the membership of the Eastport Port 28 Authority to include 6 members from Washington County. It also expands the liability for new bonds issued by the authority from 30 all property within the boundaries of the City of Eastport to all property within the boundaries of Washington County.

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
