20 Provides funds for the establishment of the Maine 22 Governmental Information Network Board, which, among 24 other things, will provide grants to counties and 26 municipalities to fund the purchase of computer hardware, 28 software peripherals and to link them with each other and the 30 State's wide-area computer 32 network.

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SUMMARY

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This bill expands access to the electronic databases of the State by creating the Maine Governmental Information Network Board. The board is charged with overseeing the expansion of the State's wide-area computer network to encompass municipalities, counties and other providers of state services. This bill requires the Secretary of State to provide administrative support to the board. This bill seeks an appropriation from the General Fund of \$5,000,000 during the 2000-2001 biennium.
