A. "Milk" means the lacteal secretion, practically free from colostrum, obtained by the complete milking of one or more healthy cows, goats or sheep.

SUMMARY

This bill repeals and replaces certain statutes governing the production and distribution of milk and milk products. This bill grants the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources continued regulatory authority to adopt rules that reflect the standards outlined by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance and clarifies the licensing fee schedule for milk distributors.
