22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the

26	'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305, §1, is amended to read:

30	1. Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage is \$4.25 \$5.65 per hour. Beginning November 1, 2000, the minimum hourly wage is \$6.15 per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased
32	in-excess-of-\$4-25-per-hour to an amount that exceeds the minimum
34	hourly wage in effect in the State at that time, the minimum wage must be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date
36	as the increase in the federal minimum wage, -but-in-no-ease-may the-minimum-wage-exceed-\$5,15-per-hour.
38	Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated

20	This bill will require the revision of the Minimum Wage poster by the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards. A
22	General Fund appropriation of \$12,134 in fiscal year 1999-00 is provided for printing and mailing costs. If other bills are
24	enacted that also require changes to the poster, the cost properly allocated to this bill can be reduced.'

28	SUMMARY
30	This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It increases the minimum wage to \$5.65 on November 1, 1999 and \$6.15
32	on November 1, 2000. If the federal minimum wage is higher than the level set by the State at any time, the federal minimum wage
34	becomes the State's minimum wage as well.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
