	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305,
4	§1, is amended to read:
б	1. Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage is \$4-25 <u>\$5.50</u> per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess
8	of \$4.25 \$5.15 per hour, the minimum wage must be increased to the same-amount 35¢ above the federal minimum wage, effective or
10	the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage,-but-in no-ease-may-the-minimum-wage-exceed-\$5,15-per-hour.
12	Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect November 1, 1999.

16	SUMMARY
18	This bill increases the minimum wage to \$5.50 per hour
20	effective November 1, 1999. It also provides that the state wag increase to an amount 35¢ above the federal minimum wage if that
22	minimum is increased above the current \$5.15 per hour rate.
