An Act to Expand the State's Risk Management Responsibilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1737, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1997, c. 46, 4 §1, is further amended to read: Directed services. Notwithstanding the provisions of 4. 6 subsection 2, the director may provide insurance advice or services for family foster homes as defined in Title 22, section 8 8101, subsection 3; specialized children's homes, as defined in 10 Title 22, section 8101, subsection 5; respite care providers as defined in Title 34-B, section 6201, subsection 2-A; group homes 12 for persons receiving services from the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, under 14 Title 34-B, chapter 5 and chapter 6; the Casco Bay Island Transit District created by Private and Special Law 1981, chapter 22; the 16 University of Maine System; the Maine Technical College System; the Maine Maritime Academy; and the State's service delivery 18 areas designated under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, Public Law 97-300, as amended. 20 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §1737, sub-§4-A is enacted to read: 22 4-A. Additional directed services. Notwithstanding 24 subsection 2, the director shall provide insurance advice and services for all lines of property and casualty insurance for 26 school administrative units and for private schools approved for tuition purposes that have more than 60% of students publicly 28 funded. 30 **SUMMARY** 32 This bill expands the risk management responsibilities of 34 the Director of the Bureau of General Services to allow the director to provide insurance advice or services for group homes 36 under the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services and to require the director to provide 38 insurance advice and services for all lines of property and casualty insurance for school administrative units and certain 40 private schools.
