An Act to Amend the Statutes Regarding Maine Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1831, sub-§1, ¶D is enacted to read:

D. As part of the admission process, the hospital or 6 nursing facility shall identify all patients or residents who have served at least 180 days on active duty in the 8 United States Armed Forces and inform such patients or residents prior to discharge of the availability and locations statewide of Maine Veterans' Homes facilities and 10 services. The facilities and services of the Maine Veterans' Homes and of all other entities identified by the 12 Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, Bureau of Veterans' Services as providing health care 14 services to veterans in Maine must be included on all lists of licensed providers provided to patients and residents 16 pursuant to this subsection by hospitals and nursing 18 facilities.

20 Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §601, as amended by PL 1997, c. 395, Pt. P, §1, is further amended to read:

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§601. Home established; purpose

There must be public homes for veterans in Maine known as 26 "Maine Veterans' Homes." In addition to the existing 120-bed home located in Augusta, a 120-bed home located in Scarborough, a home not to exceed 40 beds located in Caribou, a home located in 28 Bangor not to exceed 120 beds, of which 40 beds are dedicated to 30 senile dementia patients, and a home located in South Paris not to exceed 90 beds, of which 30 beds are dedicated to senile dementia patients, may be constructed if federal Veterans' 32 Administration funds are available to meet part of the costs of 34 each facility for construction or operation. In addition, a home located in Machias not to exceed 60 beds may be constructed if federal Veterans' Administration funds or funds from any other 36 state, federal or private source are available to meet part of 38 the costs of the facility for construction or operation, except that the Machias home may not begin operation prior to July 1, 40 1995 and the construction and funding of the Machias home may not in any way jeopardize the construction, funding or financial viability of any other home. The Maine Veterans' Homes also are 42 authorized to provide nonnursing facility care and services to Maine veterans if approved by appropriate state and federal 44 authorities. The Board of Trustees of the Maine Veterans' Homes 46 shall plan and develop the Machias home and any nonnursing facility care and services using any funds available for that 48 purpose, except for the Augusta facility's funded depreciation Any funds loaned to the Maine Veterans' Homes for account. operating purposes from the funded depreciation accounts of the 50 Maine Veterans' Homes must be reimbursed from any funds received 52 by the Maine Veterans' Homes and available for that purpose. The

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primary purpose of the homes <u>Maine Veterans' Homes</u> is to provide
support and care for honorably discharged veterans who served on active duty in the United States Armed Forces for no less than
180 days.

6 Sec. 3. 37-B MRSA §610-B, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 395, Pt. P, §6, is amended to read:

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The Maine Veterans' Homes shall expend stipend funds 10 received pursuant to section 610-A first primarily on the payment of debt service on, or the setting aside of funds irrevocably to 12 repay as soon as possible, the outstanding principal amount of the bonded indebtedness of the homes and the bonded indebtedness 14 of the State on which the homes are obligated to pay debt service. Any interest earned on funds set aside irrevocably to 16 repay such bonded indebtedness must be credited to the General Fund.

SUMMARY

22 This bill clarifies that the Maine Veterans' Homes can provide nonnursing facility care and services to eligible Maine 24 veterans, if approved by appropriate federal and state authorities.

The bill also requires that stipend funds received from the 28 federal Veterans' Administration and retained by the Maine Veterans' Homes are to be used primarily for the payment of debt 30 service on the debt payable by the Maine Veterans' Homes.

32 The bill also requires veterans being discharged from hospitals and nursing facilities and requiring continuing care to 34 receive sufficient notice of the availability statewide of the facilities and services of the Maine Veterans' Homes.
