Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall, within
existing resources, convene a study group to review the current
laws, rules and policies concerning the muzzle-loading season.

concerning the muzzle-loading season including:

- Sec. 2. Selection of chair. Resolved: That the study group shall select a chair from among the members at the first meeting; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Public hearings. Resolved: That the study group shall 28 hold public hearings at various locations throughout the State to 30 public comment on the issues related muzzle-loading season that are to be addressed by the study 32 group. The locations for the public hearings may be selected upon current Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 34 divisions or regions throughout the State; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Staffing. Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall provide staffing and clerical support to the study group. The department may also request drafting assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Report; legislation. Resolved: That the study group shall submit its report and any necessary legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by February 1, 2000. If the study group requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
