38	individualized plan for the juvenile's rehabilitation.

A public school may not publish on the Internet or provide for publication on the Internet any 8 personal information about its students without first obtaining the written approval of those students' parents. For the purpose 10 of this section, "personal information" means information that identifies a student, including, but not limited to, the student's full name, photograph, personal biography, e-mail 12 address, home address, date of birth, social security number and 14 parents' names. 16 3. Dissemination of education records to criminal justice agencies. A school may disseminate education records as defined 18 in 20 United States Code, Section 1232 g(a)(4) regarding a juvenile if: 20 A. The juvenile has not been adjudicated as having 22 committed a juvenile crime; 24 B. The education records are disseminated to: 26 (1) Criminal justice agencies; or 28 (2) Agencies that by court order or agreement of the juvenile are responsible for the health or welfare of 30 the juvenile and that have provided the school with a statement describing the purpose of the dissemination; 32 and 34 C. The education records are relevant to and disseminated for the purpose of creating or maintaining an individualized 36 plan for the juvenile's rehabilitation. Education records received under this subsection are confidential 38 and may not be further disseminated, except to the court or as otherwise provided by law. The persons to whom the education 40 records are disseminated shall certify in writing to the school that the records will not be disclosed to any other party, except 42 the court or as otherwise provided by law, without the written 44 consent of the juvenile or the juvenile's parent or guardian.' 46 SUMMARY 48 This amendment replaces the bill and is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. amendment authorizes schools to disseminate education records of 2 preadjudicated juveniles to criminal justice agencies or agencies that by court order or agreement of the juvenile are responsible for the health or welfare of the juvenile. The education records 4 may be disseminated only if the records are relevant to and disseminated for the purpose of creating or maintaining an б individualized plan for the juvenile's rehabilitation. Education 8 records received are confidential and may not be further disseminated, except to the court or as otherwise provided by 10 law. The persons to whom the education records are disseminated shall certify in writing to the school that the records will not 12 be disclosed to any other party, except the court or as otherwise provided by law, without the written consent of the juvenile or 14 the juvenile's parent or quardian.
