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Whereas, this resolve establishes the Commission to Propose a Process for the Sharing of Information Between Schools, Criminal Justice Agencies and Other Agencies Responsible for the Health and Welfare of Juveniles; and

44 Whereas, this resolve is necessary to conduct an immediate review of the current information-sharing process and to identify 46 methods to help juveniles; and

Whereas, many juveniles are in need of intervention and special support in order to succeed in school and society; and

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Whereas,	the	coll	aborat	ion	and c	ooper	ation	of	schools,

- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Propose a Process for the Sharing of Information Between Schools, Criminal Justice Agencies and Other Agencies Responsible for the Health and Welfare of Juveniles, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 16 members as follows:
 - One member of the Senate who sits on the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the President of the Senate;
 - One member of the House of Representatives who sits on the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 3. One member of the House of Representatives who sits on the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 4. A representative of the Maine Superintendents 34 Association, appointed by the President of the Senate;
 - A representative of the Maine Principals' Association, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 6. A representative of the Maine Education Association, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 7. A member of a parent-teacher organization, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 8. The Chief Judge of the District Court or the chief 46 judge's designee;
- 48 9. The Commissioner of Corrections or the commissioner's designee;

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- The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's 2 10. designee; 4 11. The Commissioner of Human Services the 6 commissioner's designee; 8 The Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services or the commissioner's designee; 10 The President of the Maine Prosecutors Association or 12 the president's designee; 14 The President of the Maine Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers or the president's designee; 16 The President of the Maine Chiefs of Police or the 15. 18 president's designee; and The President of the Maine Sheriffs' Association or the 20 president's designee; and be it further 22 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the 24 Senate chair and the first named House member is the House chair; and be it further 26 Sec. 4. Appointments. Resolved: That appointments of members 28 of the commission must be made no later than 30 days after the effective date of this resolve. Appointing authorities shall 30 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the selections have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than July 1, 2000; and be it further 34 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall invite the 36 participation of experts and interested parties, information and request necessary data from public and private 38 entities in order to: 40
- 1. Review the current laws and processes for sharing information about juveniles;

- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Expenses. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at the authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report with any implementing legislation to the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by November 1, 2000. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further
- Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from commission staff, shall administer the commission budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report of the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further
- Sec. 10. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. amendment creates a 16-member study commission to review the current laws and processes for sharing information about juveniles; to identify the information needs of agencies with respect to their ability to provide for the health and welfare of juveniles, including the creation and maintenance individualized plans to ensure the success and the rehabilitation of juveniles; and to make necessary recommendations to propose changes to the current laws and processes regarding the sharing of information among schools, criminal justice agencies and other agencies responsible for the health and welfare of juveniles. The commission shall report its findings and any recommended legislation to the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by November 1, 2000. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

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
