An Act to Recognize Veterans of the Persian Gulf Conflict.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §7054, sub-§1, ¶D, as amended by PL 1995, c. 115, \$1, is further amended to read: 4 6 D. "War, campaign or expedition" means any of the following periods: 8 April 6, 1917 to November 10, 1918; (1) 10 (2) December 7, 1941 to September 1, 1945; 12 (3) June 27, 1950 to January 31, 1955; 14 (4) August 5, 1964 to May 7, 1975; and 16 (5) August 7, 1990 to August-7,-1991 the date that the United States Government recognizes as the end of the 18 Persian Gulf War. 20 Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §653 sub-§1, ¶C, as amended by PL 1995, c. 368, Pt. CCC, §1 and affected by §11, is further amended to read: 22 The estates up to the just value of \$5,000, having a 24 c. taxable situs in the place of residence, of veterans who served in the Armed Forces of the United States: 26 any federally recognized war 28 (1)During period, including the Korean Campaign, the Vietnam War and the 30 Persian Gulf War, when they have reached the age of 62 years or when they are receiving any form of pension or compensation from the United States Government for 32 total disability, service-connected or 34 nonservice-connected, as a veteran. A veteran of the Vietnam War must have served on active duty for a 36 period of more than 180 days, any part of which occurred after August 4, 1964 and before May 7, 1975, unless the veteran died in service or was discharged 38 for a service-connected disability after that date. 40 "Vietnam War" means the period between August 5, 1964 and May 7, 1975. "Persian Gulf War" means service on 42 active duty between on or after August 7, 1990 and April-11,-1991 before or on the date that the United 44 States Government recognizes as the end of that war period; or 46 (2) Who are disabled by injury or disease incurred or 48 aggravated during active military service in the line of duty and are receiving any form of pension or 50 compensation from the United States Government for total, service-connected disability. 52

The exemptions provided in this paragraph apply to the property of that veteran, including property held in joint tenancy with that veteran's spouse or held in a revocable living trust for the benefit of that veteran.

Sec. 3. 36 MRSA §653 sub-§1, ¶D-1, as amended by PL 1995, c. 368, Pt. CCC, §3 and affected by §11, is further amended to read:

D-1. The estates up to the just value of \$47,500, having a taxable situs in the place of residence, for specially 10 adapted housing units, of veterans who served in the Armed 12 Forces of the United States during any federally recognized war period, including the Korean Campaign, the Vietnam War 14 and the Persian Gulf War, and who are paraplegic veterans within the meaning of the Code, Title 38, Chapter 21, 16 Section 2101, and who received a grant from the United States Government for any such housing, or of the unremarried widows of such veterans. 18 A veteran of the Vietnam War must have served on active duty for a period of more than 180 days, any part of which occurred after August 20 4, 1964 and before May 7, 1975, unless the veteran died in service or was discharged for a service-connected disability 22 after that date. "Vietnam War" means the period between August 5, 1964 and May 7, 1975. "Persian Gulf War" means 24 service on active duty between on or after August 7, 1990 26 and April-11,--1991 before or on the date that the United States Government recognizes as the end of that war period. The exemption provided in this paragraph applies to the 28 property of the veteran including property held in joint 30 tenancy with a spouse or held in a revocable living trust for the benefit of that veteran.

Sec. 4. 37-B MRSA §504, sub-§4, ¶A-1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1993, c. 680, Pt. A, §33, is amended to read:

- A-1. As used in this subsection, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the following

••	This bill expands the description of the Persian Gulf War
42	period in various provisions of law to comport with the federally
	recognized war period. It gives Persian Gulf War veterans the
44	same preferences in employment, rights to burial in the Veterans'
	Memorial Cemetery and property tax exemptions as veterans of
46	other wars.
