An Act to Change the Membership of the Medicaid Advisory Committee and the Board of Directors of the Maine Health Data Organization.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §8703, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1997, c. 568,
4	§1, is further amended to read:
6	2. Board of directors. The organization operates under the supervision of a board of directors, which consists of 18 <u>19</u>
8	voting members.
10	A. The Governor shall appoint 16 <u>17</u> board members in accordance with the following requirements. Appointments by
12	the Governor are not subject to review or confirmation.
14	(1) Three members must represent consumers. For the purposes of this section, "consumer" means a person who
16	is not affiliated with or employed by a 3rd-party payor, a provider or an association representing those
18	providers or those 3rd-party payors.
20	(2) Three members must represent employers. One member must be chosen from a list provided by a health
22	management coalition in this State.
24	(3) Two members must represent 3rd-party payors.
26	(4) Eight <u>Nine</u> members must represent providers. Two provider members must represent hospitals chosen from a
28	list of at least 5 current hospital representatives provided by the Maine Hospital Association. Two
30	provider members must be physicians or representatives of physicians chosen from a list of at least 5 nominees
32	provided jointly by the Maine Medical Association and the Maine Osteopathic Association. One provider member
34	must be a dentist chosen from a list of at least 3 nominees provided by the Maine Dental Association. One
36	provider member must be a chiropractor chosen from a list provided by a statewide chiropractic association.
38	One provided by a statewide chiloplactic association. One provider member must be a pharmacist chosen from a list provided by a statewide pharmacist association.
40	The names of pharmacists submitted by the statewide
42	pharmacist association must include only those pharmacists registered and practicing in the State.
44	Two provider members must be representatives of other health care providers, at least one of whom is a
46	current representative of a home health care company.
	B. The commissioner shall appoint 2 members who are
48	employees of the department to represent the State's interest in maintaining health data and to ensure that

information collected is available for determining public health policy.

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C. All appointments must be completed by May 1, 1996.

6 Sec. 2. Deadline for appointing pharmacist member to Board of Directors of the Maine Health Data Organization. Notwithstanding the 8 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 8703, subsection 2, paragraph C, the pharmacist member of the Board of Directors of 10 the Maine Health Data Organization appointed pursuant to this Act must be appointed no later than 60 days after the effective date 12 of this Act.

14 Sec. 3. Department of Human Services to include pharmacist on Medicaid Advisory Committee. The Department of Human Services 16 shall include in the membership of the Medicaid Advisory Committee a pharmacist member who is both registered and 18 practicing in the State. The department shall report back on this change to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human 20 Services no later than January 15, 2000.

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SUMMARY

This bill amends the membership of the Board of Directors of 26 the Maine Health Data Organization to include a pharmacist The pharmacist must be registered in the State and also member. 28 practicing pharmacy in the State to be eligible to serve as a The bill also directs the Department of member on the board. 30 Human Services to include a pharmacist member on the Medicaid Advisory Committee. The Department of Human Services shall report back on this change to the Joint Standing Committee on 32 Health and Human Services no later than January 15, 2000.
