22 Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated
24 "§12304." by striking out all of subsection 2 and inserting in
its place the following:

26 '2. Members. The Advisory Committee on Dental Education

appointed by the Speaker;

(5) One member appointed by the President who

dedicated to the cause of affordable health care;

(6) One member appointed by the President who represents a major statewide organization dedicated to ensuring equal justice; and

(7) One Senator appointed by the President.


The chief executive officer may submit recommendations for appointees under this paragraph to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House;

B. Two voting members, one of whom represents the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health, Oral Health Program and one of whom represents the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services, both appointed by the Commissioner of Human Services; and

C. Two nonvoting members, one of whom represents the authority and one of whom represents an office of primary health care, both appointed by the chief executive officer.'

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the manner of appointment of the 12 members of the Advisory Committee on Dental Education by providing for 8 appointments by the presiding officers, 2 departmental appointments by the Commissioner of Human Services and 2 nonvoting appointments by the chief executive officer of the Finance Authority of Maine.
