36	This amendment has no net fiscal impact to the level of contributions to the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund that

## **SUMMARY**

This amendment removes the language in the bill that would have increased the taxable wage base from \$7,000 to \$12,000. This amendment also changes the definition of "ratio of total wages to taxable wages" to maintain the increases in revenue to the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund accomplished by the bill.
