SUMMARY

This bill implements one of the recommendations of the Lobster Advisory Council regarding limited entry into the lobster fishery. It establishes a Lobster License Appeals Board composed of 3 members appointed by the Commissioner of Marine Resources to review appeals from individuals who are denied a lobster and crab fishing license because they do not meet the eligibility requirements for a license. The board shall make recommendations to the commissioner regarding the approval or denial of an appeal, and the commissioner shall make the final decision on an appeal.
