

**Resolve, to Create a Committee to Establish a Memorial Dedicated to
the Civilian Conservation Corps.**

2 **Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved:** That the Committee to
Establish a Memorial Dedicated to the Civilian Conservation
4 Corps, referred to in this resolve as the "committee," is
established; and be it further

6 **Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved:** That the committee consists of
the following 9 members:

8
1. Three former members of the Civilian Conservation Corps
10 appointed by the Civilian Conservation Corps Alumni of Maine;

12 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by
the Speaker of the House;

3. One member of the Senate appointed by the President of
16 the Senate;

18 4. Two public members, one appointed by the President of
the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

5. The Commissioner of Conservation or the commissioner's
22 designee; and be it further

24 **Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved:** That all
appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the
26 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the
Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing
28 authorities once the selections have been made. The President of
the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
30 jointly appoint the chair of the committee; and be it further

32 **Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved:** That the committee shall study
issues involved in the establishment of a memorial dedicated to
34 the Civilian Conservation Corps including:

36 1. Where the memorial should be located;

38 2. What should be inscribed on the memorial; and

40 3. A funding mechanism for building the memorial,
including, but not limited to, a public and private partnership;
42 and be it further

44 **Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the Department of
Conservation shall provide staffing assistance to the committee;
46 and be it further

48 **Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved:** That all members of the
committee who are not state employees are entitled to
50 reimbursement for expenses as defined in the Maine Revised
Statutes, Title 5, section 12002 and members who are Legislators

2 are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and
reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to
4 their attendance at meetings of the committee; and be it further

6 **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That the Committee to Establish a
Memorial Dedicated to the Civilian Conservation Corps shall
8 submit its report, together with any necessary implementing
legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 119th
10 Legislature no later than January 15, 2000.

14 This resolve creates the Committee to Establish a Memorial
Dedicated to the Civilian Conservation Corps.
