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HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1400, L.D. 2005, "Resolve, to Establish the Maine Forest Policy Round Table Study Commission"

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Amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 2 in paragraph D in the 4th line (page 2, line 20 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "Labor" the following: 'or who have experience in a forest-based industry'

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Further amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 3 in paragraph D in the 4th line (page 2, line 40 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "Labor" the following: 'or who have experience in a forest-based industry'

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SUMMARY

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Currently, the bill as amended by committee amendment "A" requires the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate each to appoint 2 members to the round table who serve either on the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry or the Joint Standing Committee on Labor. This amendment allows the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate to appoint legislative members who have experience in a forest-based industry.
