22	Amend the bill in section 10 in paragraph G in the 3rd line
24	(page 2, line 16 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "4 grams or more or 180" and inserting in its place the following: '6
26	grams or more or 270'
28	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:
30	
32	'FISCAL NOTE
34	This bill may increase the penalty for certain crimes from Class C to Class B crimes. Sentences of more than 9 months for
36	both Class C crimes and Class B crimes must be served in state correctional institutions. Since the average length of stay for
38	a Class B crime is 1 year and 3 months greater than a Class C crime, the incremental increase in the average cost to the
40	State's correctional facilities is \$34,343. Sentences of 9 months or less for both Class C crimes and Class B crimes must be
42	served in county jails. The State provides reimbursement to the counties for housing these offenders.

46	The Judicial Department may require additional General Fund appropriations to cover increased indigent defense costs related
