40 This resolve will result in net decreases of General Fund  
revenue of \$8,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 and approximately  
42 \$24,700 annually beginning in fiscal year 2001-02. The  
additional license fee revenue of \$2,000 in fiscal year 2000-01  
44 and \$300 annually beginning in fiscal year 2001-02 will be more  
than offset by the loss of General Fund revenue, \$10,000 in  
46 fiscal year 2000-01 and \$25,000 annually thereafter, resulting  
from a shift of sales from the state liquor store in Caribou.

48 The Bureau of Liquor Enforcement within the Department of  
Public Safety will incur some minor additional costs to hold a
