SUMMARY

Current law requires that school administrative units receive state subsidy for the following program costs: early childhood education program costs, special education costs, vocational education costs, transportation operating costs and bus purchase costs. However, current law also limits the State share of funding for these subsidizable program costs to the amount appropriated by the Legislature for the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program. Consequently, the amount of General Fund appropriations for the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program over the past several years has addressed less than 25% of the amount needed to fully fund the state share of actual local program costs.

The purpose of this bill is to ensure that the State's subsidy includes 100% of the state share of actual local program costs incurred by school administrative units. Under this bill, the State share of actual local program costs is fully funded, that is, the subsidy percentage reduction percentages for all program costs are 0%. This bill also proposes an additional amount of General Fund appropriations for the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program to fully fund the state share of actual local program costs.
