	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3321, sub-§§2 and 3, as enacted by PL 1991, c.
4	123, are amended to read:
б	2. Conspicuous sign. A conspicuous sign in the store entrance that states that between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.
8	the cash register contains \$50 or less, that there is a safe in
10	the store and that the safe is not accessible to the employees; and
12	3. Limited cash. During the hours of 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., no more than \$50 cash available and readily accessible to
14	employees+; and
16	Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §3321, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
18	4. Accessible telephone or alarm. An alarm or telephone within the store that is accessible to the employees. The alarm
20	must be connected to a public or private safety agency.

26	This bill prohibits a convenience store from remaining open 24 hours a day unless there is an alarm or telephone in the store accessible to the employees.
