2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2649-A is enacted to read:

	§2649-A. Motor vehicles on ice prohibited
б	1. Public water supply. Notwithstanding section 2649, a
8	person may not operate a motor vehicle, as defined in Title 29-A,
	section 101, subsection 42, on any frozen body of water that is
10	used as a public water supply.
12	<b>2. Exception.</b> The municipal officials, as defined in Title 30-A, section 2001, subsection 11, of a municipality that has a
14	public water supply within its boundaries may promulgate regulations governing the granting of a day pass allowing the
16	operation of motor vehicle on that body of water. The pass is
18	restricted to a one-time use and may only be granted for a reason
10	<u>determined by the municipal officials to be in the best interest</u> of the public.

22	3. Violation. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$200 may be adjudged for any one offense.

	This bill prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle on any
30	frozen body of water that is used as a public water supply. The bill does provide for a one-time day pass that may be granted to
32	allow a motor vehicle to be driven on the ice when it is in the
34	best interest of the public.
