Resolve, to Establish the Blue Ribbon Commission to Establish a Comprehensive Internet Policy.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 205.

Presented by Senator KONTOS of Cumberland. Cosponsored by Representative TRIPP of Topsham. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the Internet continues to grow and it is essential to ensure delivery of social and economic benefits to the State; and

Whereas, it is necessary to consider what type of statewide computing and communications investment strategy will stimulate public investment and create more opportunities and incentives for information technology business to locate in the State; and

14 Whereas, it is imperative to address how to develop and maintain a highly qualified information technology workforce to 16 support business growth; and

18 Whereas, it is essential to create a business and regulatory policy that will ensure that Maine is an attractive location for information technology companies and their employees; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

28 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Blue Ribbon Commission to Establish a Comprehensive Internet Policy, referred 30 to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 34 consists of 12 members appointed as follows:

36 1. Five members from the information industry, appointed by the Governor;

2. Four Legislators from the Joint Standing Committee on 40 Business and Economic Development, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House;

3. One member from the University of Maine System, 44 appointed by the Chancellor of the University of Maine System;

46 4. The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's designee; and

5. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development 50 or the commissioner's designee; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments: meetings. **Resolved:** 2 That a]] appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 4 Legislative Council notified must be by all appointing б authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative 8 Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the The commission shall select a chair from among its commission. members: and be it further 10 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study 12 issues related to the future of information technology in the 14 State, including, but not limited to: 16 The facilitation of electronic commerce for Maine 1. companies; 18 Making government more accessible to the citizens; 2. 20 3. The protection of consumer and citizen privacy; 22 4. The mitigation of unsolicited bulk e-mail or spamming; 24 The regulation of hate mail and pornography; and 5. 26 6. The elimination of electronic crimes; and be it further 28 Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may 30 request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further 32 That Sec. 6. Expenses. **Resolved:** the members of the commission may not receive any compensation or reimbursement for 34 expenses; and be it further 36 Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That no later than January 15, 2000, the commission shall submit its report, together with any 38 necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing 40 Committee on Business and Economic Development and the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. The Joint Standing 42 Committee on Business and Economic Development is authorized to report out any legislation during the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature concerning the findings and recommendations 44 of the commission. 46 If the commission requires an extension, it may apply to the 48 Legislative Council, which may grant the extension. 50 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
