<u>§275. Tobacco suit settlement</u>

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Any award or settlement amount received by the State from a 10 tobacco company pursuant to an action brought by the State against cigarette manufacturers and any other funds received as a 12 result of any action involving the tobacco industry must be divided equally between the Tobacco Prevention and Control Fund 14 and the Health Care Fund for Maine Citizens. The Attorney General may recover the costs of bringing the action upon 16 allocation of funds by the Legislature.

SUMMARY

36 This bill establishes the Tobacco Prevention and Control Fund and the Health Care Fund for Maine Citizens. The bill 38 continues the commitment of tobacco tax revenues for the prevention and control of tobacco usage prevention and control 40 and provides that settlement funds received from legal actions by the State against tobacco companies be divided equally between 42 the Tobacco Prevention and Control Fund and the Health Care Fund for Maine Citizens.
