Whereas, no formal study has been done to evaluate the extent of these practices that threaten the public health and safety and the need for governmental response or oversight; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 10 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 12 safety; now, therefore,

**14** Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §901, sub-§3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 499, §1, is amended to read:

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B. "Mislabeled" means having a label or trademark varying
 from the standard of truth and disclosure in labeling
 prescribed by statute or lawfully promulgated administrative
 regulation, or if none, as set by established commercial
 usage. "Mislabeled" includes but is not limited to
 counterfeiting or the unauthorized reproducing of a
 trademark.

Sec. 2. 17-A MRSA §901, sub-§3-A is enacted to read:

3-A. A commodity or item bearing marks in violation of this
 section or personal property, including, but not limited to, tools, machines, equipment, instrumentalities or vehicles of any
 kind, employed or used in connection with the violation is contraband and may be seized by a law enforcement officer. A
 person convicted of a violation of this section forfeits to the State all rights, privileges, interests and claims to property
 seized under this subsection.

 38 Sec. 3. Commission established. The Commission to Study Counterfeiting and the Unauthorized Sale of Consumer Goods and Labels, referred to in this section as the "commission," is established.

Commission membership. The commission consists of 9
 members as follows:

A. Two Senators, one of whom is a member of the minority party, appointed by the President of the Senate;

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Two members of the House of Representatives, one of whom R. is a member of the minority party, appointed by the Speaker 2 of the House: 4 C. One member representing a labor organization, appointed by the President of the Senate; 6 8 D. One member representing state law enforcement, appointed by the President of the Senate; 10 One member representing the district attorneys of the Ε. 12 State, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 14 One member representing municipal law enforcement, F. appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 16 G. One member representing retail merchants, appointed by 18 the Speaker of the House. 20 2. Chairs. The first Senate member named is the Senate chair and the first House member named is the House chair. 22 Appointments. Appointments to the commission must be 3. 24 made within 30 days of the effective date of this Act. Appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the 26 Legislative Council once the selections have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting 28 of the commission no later than July 1, 2000. 30 The commission shall invite the participation 4. Duties. of experts and interested parties, gather information and request 32 necessary data from public and private entities in order to:

34 Examine the effect of counterfeit goods in the State, Α. including the effect of counterfeit Universal Price Code 36 labels on state revenue, losses to merchants and manufacturers of legitimate goods and the impact on 38 consumers;

B. Examine the sale of consumer products at unused property sales and flea markets, including whether these sales are authorized and the potentially harmful consequences of the sale of these products; and

C. Examine whether current state law acts as an appropriate deterrent or imposes sufficient sanctions for such conduct.

5. Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide
 necessary staffing services to the commission.

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2 6. Expenses. The legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at the 4 authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who 6 are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities whom they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at 8 authorized meetings of the commission.

7. Report. The commission shall submit a report with any
implementing legislation to the First Regular Session of the
120th Legislature by December 1, 2000. If the commission
requires a limited extension of time to conclude its study and
make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which
may grant the extension.

18 8. Budget. The chairs of the commission, with assistance from commission staff, shall administer the commission budget.
20 The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from
22 the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall provide the commission chairs and staff with a status
24 report of the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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26	The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the commission during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing
28	existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing
30	assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for
32	staff services.
34	The additional costs associated with participating as a member of the commission can be absorbed by the Department of

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### COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 775, L.D. 2174

#### **SUMMARY**

4 This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment amends provisions dealing with deceptive business practices under the 6 fraud provisions of the Maine Criminal Code. The amendment specifies that "mislabeled" for the purposes of the deceptive 8 business practices law includes counterfeiting or unauthorized reproducing of a trademark.

This amendment adds to the deceptive business practices law a seizure provision that specifies that any item that bears marks in violation of that law or any property that was used in or can be connected to the violation is contraband and may be seized by a law enforcement officer.

The amendment establishes the Commission to Study Counterfeiting and the Unauthorized Sale of Consumer Goods and 18 Labels. The commission's duties include examining the effect of 20 counterfeit goods in this State, including the effect of counterfeit Universal Price Code labels on state revenue, losses to merchants and manufacturers of legitimate goods and the impact 22 on consumers; examining the sale of consumer products at unused 24 property sales and flea markets, including whether these sales are authorized and the potentially harmful consequences of the sale of these products; and examining whether current state law 26 acts as an appropriate deterrent or imposes sufficient sanctions for such conduct. The commission shall report its findings and 28 any recommended legislation to the First Regular Session of the 30 120th Legislature by December 1, 2000.
