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2 Sec. 3. Final report to next Legislature; authority to report out The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial legislation. Services shall report to the joint standing committee of the 4 Legislature having jurisdiction over state government matters on б the efforts of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to implement the policy on the use of automated 8 telephone answering equipment by state agencies. The final report, which must be made in person to the committee by January 10 19, 2001, must include information similar to that required to be included in the preliminary report. The commissioner shall also 12 recommend to the committee any legislation necessary to assist in the implementation of a new policy. Following receipt of the 14 final report, the committee may report out a bill to the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.' 16

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 18 summary the following:

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'FISCAL NOTE

This bill will increase costs to several state departments 24 and agencies that are currently using an automated telephone answering system to handle a high volume of incoming telephone 26 The bill's exemption for telephone lines dedicated to calls. providing general information may exempt some of these high volume telephone answering systems, but may not exempt all 28 affected state departments and agencies. The agencies most 30 affected by this bill include the Bureau of Employment Security within the Department of Labor, the Bureau of Family Independence 32 within the Department of Human Services, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department of the Secretary of State and the 34 Bureau Revenue Services within the of Department of Administrative and Financial Services.

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The amount of additional costs associated with providing 38 staffing for those lines not exempted by the bill and the additional telephone system reprogramming costs can not be 40 determined at this time.

 The Department of Administrative and Financial Services will incur some minor additional costs to compile information and
provide certain reports. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report. The amendment requires the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial 4 Services to make both preliminary and final reports to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over б state government matters on the implementation of a new policy on 8 the use of automated telephone answering equipment by state agencies. The amendment also grants authority to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 10 state government matters to report out a bill during the First 12 Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. It also adds a fiscal note.
