Sec. 1. Development recommendations. Resolved: That the Maine

Forest Service shall develop recommendations for how to end the practice of liquidation harvesting in Maine's forests described in the 1998 report, Timber Liquidation in Maine: A Report by the Maine Forest Service. In developing its recommendations, the Maine Forest Service shall consider the heavy cutting law and the timber gains tax law adopted by the State of Vermont and any other possible solutions; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Maine Forest Service shall present its recommendations, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by December 31, 1999. The Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may submit legislation in the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature to implement the recommendations of the Maine Forest Service.
