20	This amendment requires that chiropractors engaging in acupuncture obtain a chiropractic acupuncture certification from									
22	the Board of Chiropractic Licensure. Certification requirements will be developed by the Board of Chiropractic Licensure by rule									
24	and must include minimum education, training and disease control components. The supervised clinical training component may be									
26	fulfilled either in conjunction with the required education or in a separate clinical setting. The amendment allows chiropractors									
28	who were engaged in the practice of chiropractic acupuncture prior to April 30, 1999 to continue that practice; however, they									
30	must comply with all of the certification requirements within 2									
2.2	years of the adoption of the rules.
