COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "/" to H.P. 1549, L.D. 2206

2 The bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$100,000 annually in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01 to provide funding 4 to support Washington and Hancock county river watershed councils in their efforts to implement recommendations in the Atlantic 6 salmon conservation plan. The amounts appropriated include funding for a contracted fundraiser, water samplers, pesticide 8 monitoring, grants to the councils and other miscellaneous expenses.'

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### SUMMARY

14 This amendment requires the Land and Water Resources Council to support Washington County and Hancock County river watershed 16 councils in their efforts to implement recommendations in the Atlantic salmon conservation plan. Through a nonprofit 18 organization supportive of Atlantic salmon interests, it will assist in the planning and implementation of local actions. The 20 Land and Water Resources Council will receive reports on their progress every 6 months and summarize this information in the 22 council's annual report to the Governor and the Legislature. The amendment also appropriates \$200,000 over the biennium to support 24 the watershed councils and adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
