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## SUMMARY

the This bill contains provisions to implement 40 recommendations of the Commission on Eating Disorders. It includes establishing an Office of Eating Disorders in the 42 Department of Human Services, establishing an Eating Disorders Advisory Board and requiring a report from the Office of Eating 44 Disorders by February 1, 2000 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services on laws to regulate businesses that sell products or services promoting weight loss. 46 This bill contains an appropriation for one position within the Office of 48 Eating Disorders of \$44,643 and \$53,427 for fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01 for the Department of Human Services.
