Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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4	Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §136 is enacted to read:
7	<u>§136. Kate James Day</u>
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	December 3rd is designated as Kate James Day, and the
8	Governor shall annually issue a proclamation inviting and urging
	the people of the State of Maine to observe the day in schools
0	and other suitable places with appropriate ceremony and
	activity. This day commemorates the life of Kate James, who was
2	born December 3, 1980 and who passed away March 6, 1999 at 18
	years of age while awaiting a double lung transplant. The
	observance is created to make Maine citizens aware of the
	importance of donating organs, which could improve and save
	lives. The Department of Education shall make appropriate
	information available to the people and the schools within the
	limits of its budget.
