2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §7802, sub-§2, ¶B, as amended by PL 1991, c.
4	69, §1, is further amended to read:
6	B. The terms of full licenses or approvals are as follows.
8	(1) Except as provided in subparagraphs (2) and $(3)$ and $(4)$ , the term of all full licenses and approvals
10	issued pursuant to this chapter is for one year or the remaining period of a conditional or provisional
12	license that has been issued for less than one year.
14	(2) The term of a residential child care facility license is for 2 years.
16	(3) The term of a drug treatment center license may be
18	for either one or 2 years.
20	(4) The term of a family foster home or specialized foster home license is for 2 years.

26	This bill extends the term of a family foster home or specialized foster home license from a one-year period to a
