An Act Concerning Eligibility Requirements for State Employees in the Purchase of Military Service Credits.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, ¶¶A and C, as enacted by PL 4 1985, c. 801, $\S$ and 7, are amended to read: б A. On the date of retirement, the member must have at least 15 5 years of creditable service. 8 C. The member must have separated from the armed forces 10 under conditions other than dishonorable, providing that the separation was not upgraded through a program of general 12 amnesty. 14 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, $\S$ and 7, is repealed. 16 Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §17760, sub-§2, ¶E, as amended by PL 1989, c. 18 907, $\S$ 3, is repealed. 20 **SUMMARY** 22 This bill implements one of the recommendations of the Committee to Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and 24 Other Matters Related to the Award of State of Maine Veterans' 26 Benefits. This bill reduces from 15 to 5 the number of years of creditable service a state employee who is a member of the Maine 28 State Retirement System must have before the employee is eligible to purchase service credits for service in the Armed Forces of 30 the United States. It also removes a requirement that members joining after January 1, 1976 have served in a federally 32 recognized period of conflict to be eligible to purchase military

service credits.
