COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1656, L.D. 2325, Bill, "An Act to Address Financial Inequities in Special Waste Fees"

Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in the 2nd line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "1,900" and inserting in its place the following: '550'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

2000-01

REVENUES

Other Funds (\$4,500)

Changing the benchmark by which municipal or regional association landfills pay fees for the acceptance of certain waste tonnage will reduce fee collections. The estimated annual reduction of dedicated revenue collected by the Department of Environmental Protection for the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund is \$4,500 beginning in fiscal year 2000-01.'

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the bill by providing that a

2 municipal or regional association landfill that has accepted 550  
tons, rather than 1,900 tons as proposed in the bill, or more of  
4 oil-contaminated soil, gravel, brick, concrete and other  
aggregate in 1998 shall pay \$5 per ton for that category of waste.

6 The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
