SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
16 1658, L.D. 2327, "Resolve, to Establish a Commission to Study Teacher Recruitment and Retention"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the 2nd indented 20 paragraph after the title the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

26 Whereas, it is necessary and vital to the people of the State that the cause of teacher shortages and ways of recruiting 28 and retaining teachers be determined; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it'

36 Further amend the amendment in section 4 in the 6th and 7th lines (page 2, lines 42 and 43 in amendment) by striking out the 38 following: "Chair of the Legislative Council" and inserting in its place the following: 'Commissioner of Education or the 40 commissioner's designee'

42 Further amend the amendment by striking out all of sections
 6 to 9 and inserting in their place the following:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.' '

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment reduces the General Fund cost of the bill by 10 \$38,200 in fiscal year 2000-01, resulting in no net General Fund costs in fiscal year 2000-01. 12

The Department of Education will incur some minor additional 14 costs to provide staff assistance to the commission, to participate as a member of the commission and to submit the These costs can be absorbed within the 16 required report. department's existing budgeted resources. The additional costs 18 associated with serving as a member of the Commission to Study Kindergarten-to-grade 12 Educator Recruitment and Retention can 20 be absorbed by the Department of Labor, the University of Maine System and the State Board of Education utilizing existing 22 budgeted resources.

24 As amended, this bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$30,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the State Board of 26 Education to continue research authorized in Public Law 1999, c. 401, Part GG. A corresponding deappropriation is included for 28 the Department of Education in fiscal year 2000-01 from the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program to offset the 30 funding provided to the board.

SUMMARY

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and an emergency 36 clause; requires the Commissioner of Education to convene the first meeting of the commission; requires the Department of 38 Education to provide staffing assistance; changes the date by which the commission must make its report to December 1, 2000; 40 and decreases the appropriation to \$30,000 by requiring the commission members to serve without compensation. 42
