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8 SUMMARY

10 This amendment makes the following changes to the resolve:

- 12 1. It changes the title of the resolve to align with the additional duties of addressing administrator shortages in the State;
- 16 2. It increases the commission membership total to 14 members by adding 5 new members;
- 3. It clarifies the convening process for the commission and the appointment process for the commission chair;
- 4. It adds 3 new duties to the commission charge, including the duty of addressing administrator shortages in the State and the duty of studying financial incentives for the recruitment and retention of teachers;

5. It allows the commission to request that consulting services be provided to provide staffing assistance and research services for this commission;

- 6. It clarifies that the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs during the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature; and
- 7. It adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.

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
