COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "//" to H.P. 1680, L.D. 2346, Bill, "An
20 Act to Extend the Time Period for Municipalities to Make Recommendations Concerning Great Pond Surface Use Restrictions"
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Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 and 24 inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. PL 1997, c. 739, §17, as amended by PL 1999, c. 313, §1, is further amended to read:

Sec. 17. Recommendations for regulating the use, operation and type 30 of watercraft for great ponds within the organized areas of the State. A municipality, with the approval of its legislative body, may 32 submit recommendations to the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for regulating the use, operation and type of 34 watercraft on great ponds within the jurisdiction of that municipality. For great ponds that border more than one 36 municipality, recommendations may be submitted only after approval by the legislative bodies of all municipalities in which 38 those waters are located. For great ponds that border lands within the jurisdiction of the Maine Land Use Regulation 40 Commission, the approval of the commission is also required. If a municipality chooses to prepare recommendations for such waters, it shall take into consideration the use to which those 42 waters are put, the depth of the water, the amount of water-borne 44 traffic on the waters, wildlife and environmental values, noise, traditional uses of the water body and the safety of persons and 46 property. Recommendations must be accompanied by a written explanation of the rationale for each recommendation and an 48 explanation of what issues were considered in the development of

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<u>each recommendation.</u> These recommendations may be submitted only
after a public hearing and must include a description of the resources the municipality or municipalities will use to enforce
or assist in the enforcement of those regulations if enacted.
For any municipality whose legislative body is the town meeting,
recommendations may only be considered and approved during the annual town meeting held pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes,
Title 30-A, section 2525.

10 The commissioner shall submit a report to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature by January 15, 1999 on the 12 recommendations received from municipalities prior to November 1, 1998 and shall submit a report to the Second First Regular 14 Session of the 119th 120th Legislature on the recommendations received from municipalities between November 1, 1998 and Oetober 16 30,-1999 December 1, 2000. During 2000, recommendations may be initially submitted to the department only during the month of 18 July, although materials supplementing any municipality's recommendations may be submitted until December 1, 2000. For the 20 purposes of this section, a letter to the commissioner indicating an intent to submit recommendations, including a timeline for submitting those materials, satisfies the requirements of an 22 <u>initial submission.</u> Each report must be accompanied by 24 legislation implementing the municipal recommendations supported by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. That 26 legislation may also include recommendations of the department, developed using the criteria in this section, for waters not 28 addressed in the municipal proposals.'

'FISCAL NOTE

36 The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report to the 38 Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

44 This amendment extends until December 1, 2000 the deadline for municipalities to submit recommendations to the Department of 46 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife on great pond surface use restrictions. Initial recommendation packages in 2000 may be 48 submitted only during July, although material supplementing any municipality's recommendations may be submitted until December 1,

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2000. Those recommendations will be considered by the Legislature in the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.

The amendment also requires that towns include a written explanation of the rationale for each recommendation and an explanation of what issues were considered in the development of each recommendation and requires that in a town whose legislative body is the town meeting, recommendations may only be considered and approved during the annual town meeting held pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 2525. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
