	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 34-B MRSA §1204, sub-§10 is enacted to read:
4	10. Competitive bidding. The commissioner shall place out
6	for competitive bidding all contracts and renewals of contracts for mental health services to all client groups served by the
8	department.
10	Sec. 2. Delivery of mental health services. The Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services
12	shall by rule ensure the equitable delivery of mental health services to consumers. Rules adopted pursuant to this Act are
14	routine technical rules as defined by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.
16	Rules adopted must ensure:

20	 The availability of voluntary and involuntary beds for transition, vocational rehabilitation, day treatment and residence;
22	2. That home visits and services are included in the
24	services offered to the consumers who reside in voluntary and involuntary residences;

28	3. That funding for all mental health services is distributed equitably and is available to all geographic regions of the State; and
30	4. That the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation
32	4. That the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services works closely with the Maine affiliate of the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill to ensure
34	satisfactory treatment and options to all consumers.
