SENATE AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 909, L.D. 2361

As amended, this bill also includes a Federal Expenditures Fund allocation of \$1,266,248 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the federal match associated with reimbursing pharmacies for the unpaid prescription drug copayments of Medicaid recipients. The estimated future costs in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03 will be approximately \$1,367,547 and \$1,476,951, respectively.

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and allows a pharmacy to submit a claim for reimbursement of costs and unpaid copayment to the department if a Medicaid recipient does not pay the copayment. This amendment also adds an appropriation section and an allocation section to the bill.
