## An Act to Establish State Death Benefits for State Police Officers Killed in the Line of Duty.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1596 is enacted to read:
<u>\$1596. Death benefit</u>
1. Amount; recipients. In any case in which the Chief of
the State Police determines under rules issued pursuant to this section that a state police officer, referred to in this section
as "officer," has died as the direct and proximate result of a
personal injury sustained in the line of duty, the State shall
pay a benefit of \$50,000 as follows:
A. If there is no surviving child of the officer, to the
surviving spouse of such officer;
B. If there are a surviving child or children and a
surviving spouse, 1/2 to the surviving child or children of
the officer in equal shares and 1/2 to the surviving spouse;
C. If there is no surviving spouse, to the child or
children of the officer in equal shares; or
D. If there is no surviving child or spouse of the officer,
to the parent or parents of the officer in equal shares.
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2. Interim benefit payment, Whenever the Chief of the
State Police determines upon showing of need and prior to final
action that the death of an officer is one with respect to which
a benefit will probably be paid, the chief shall notify the
Treasurer of State of this determination, and the Treasurer of
State may make an interim benefit payment not exceeding \$3,000 to the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under
subsection 1 in the manner set out in subsection 1.
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3. Deduction of interim payment. The Treasurer of State
shall deduct the amount of an interim payment made pursuant to
subsection 2 from the amount of any final benefit paid to the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under
subsection 1.
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4. Repayment of interim payment; waiver. If no final
benefit is paid, the recipient or recipients of any interim
payment under subsection 2 are liable for repayment of the amount
received. The Chief of the State Police may waive all or part of the repayment if the chief determines that undue hardship would
result from such repayment.
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5. Reductions from final benefit payment. The benefit
payable under this section is in addition to any other benefit

	that may be due from any other source except that a benefit is
2	not payable under this section with respect to the death of an
	officer if a benefit is paid pursuant to Title 5 with respect to
4	the disability of that officer.
6	6. Execution or attachment prohibited. A benefit paid
	under this section is not subject to execution or attachment.
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	7. Rulemaking. The Chief of the State Police shall propose
10	rules to carry out the purposes of this section. Rules adopted
10	pursuant to this section are major substantive rules pursuant to
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12	<u>Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.</u>
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10	SUMMARY
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	This bill, based on federal law, establishes a death benefit
18	of \$50,000 for state police officers killed in the line of duty.
	The bill designates to whom the benefit is paid and in what
20	proportion and allows for an interim payment to the surviving
	spouse, child or parent of the slain state police officer. If
22	the state police officer received or the officer's estate
	received a disability payment from the Maine State Retirement
24	System, the death benefit is not payable.
