48	Sec. B-1. Task force established. The Task Force to study Early Retirement Options, referred to in this Act as the "task force,"

is established as follows.

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2	Sec. B-2. Task force membership. The task force consists of 9 members as follows:
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6	1. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services, or the commissioner's designee;
8	2. The Commissioner of Education, or the commissioner's designee;
10	
12	 Three members representing public school teachers, appointed by the Maine Education Association;
14 16	4. One member representing superintendents in the State, appointed by the Maine School Superintendents Association;
18	5. One member representing school principals in the State, appointed by the Maine Principals' Association;
20	6. One member representing school boards in the State, appointed by the Maine School Boards Association; and
22	
24	7. One public member, appointed by the Governor.
26	Sec. B-3. Chair. The task force shall elect a chair from among its members.
28	Sec. B-4. Appointments; meetings. All appointments must be
30	made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this Act. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive
32	Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. Within 15 days after the completion of the
34	appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force. The
36	task force may hold up to 4 meetings.
	Sec. B-5. Duties. The task force shall study the impact of
38	retirement benefit changes as it relates to the quality of education in the State. The task force report must include, but
40	not be limited to, the following components:
42	1. The elimination of early retirement incentives;
44	2. The 1993 retirement benefit changes;
46	3. Early retirement programs in other states; and
48	4. The impact of the teacher retirement benefit structure on state and local policy.

2	Sec. B-6. Staff assistance. The task force may request staffing
	assistance from the Legislative Council.
4	
	Sec. B-7. Reimbursement. All members of the task force are
6	entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary
	expenses, upon application to the Legislative Council.
8	
	Sec. B-8. Report. The task force shall submit its report with
10	any accompanying legislation to the joint standing committee of
	the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor matters by January
12	15, 2001.

	SUMMARY

	This bill reduces the early retirement penalty for teacher
18	members of the Maine State Retirement System and provides for a study of the options available for teachers to retire early.
