	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the sea cucumber fishery is a new fishery; and

8	Whereas, there is inadequate scientific data to assess the

12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of

24	1. License required. It is unlawful for a person to use a
26	boat for dragging for sea cucumbers unless that boat carries a sea cucumber boat license issued by the commissioner.
28	2. Licensed activity. A boat licensed under this section
30	may be used for dragging for sea cucumbers and to possess, ship, sell or transport sea cucumbers under the license. The license also authorizes the captain and crew members aboard the licensed

38	4. Fees. The fee for a sea cucumber boat license is \$289, of which \$89 is for a general commercial fishing permit. The
